

While you have a Labor of Love fospice pet in your home, please keep our Fospice Coordinator up to date on any medical issues you see. Vet appointments for your fospice will need to be approved by the Fospice Coordinator or other Board Member. Here are some items to keep in mind when deciding if an issue requires emergency care or can be seen as a regular visit:

EMERGENCIES THAT MAY REQUIRE IMMEDIATE INTERVENTION:

- Swollen abdomen
- Difficulty breathing
- Bloody diarrhea
- Seizures, fainting or other neurological symptoms
- Accidental injury or trauma (cuts and/or fractures)
- Straining to urinate or no longer urinating at all
- Very high or low body temperature
- Unable to stand or walk
- If you have any other immediate concerns, contact the Foster Coordinator to discuss.

OTHER ISSUES THAT MAY REQUIRE VET FOLLOW-UP:

- Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Loss of appetite
- Weight Loss
- New lumps, bumps, moles
- New limping, lameness, difficulty walking/standing
- Sneezing, coughing, discharge from eyes
- Other notable behavioral changes
- If you have any other concerns, contact the Foster Coordinator to discuss.
